Introduction


The "Maldives Public Service Job Family Model" provides a standardized system of classifying occupations and professions across the public service organizations of the Maldives. The model is derived from the system of classification and occupational aggregation specified in "The Maldives Public Service Standard Classification of Occupations 2018 (MISSCO-18)".

The primary aim of this model is to aggregate occupations and professions that have commonalities in their roles, knowledge, skills and competencies required, leading to the derivation of job specifications and ranking of each occupation and profession, with the eventual articulation of a distinct salary structure for each occupation and profession albeit in the confines of a consolidated remuneration framework across the public service of the Maldives.

This model have been developed after analyzing relevant information provided by the public service organizations. The National Pay Commission will undertake periodic reviews of the model to ensure the changes in roles and functions of occupations and professions are reflected in the model accordingly.

Structure of the Job Family Model


The Maldives Public Service Job Family Model is hierarchical and has four tiers. Three are supplied within the model itself for categorizing roles and the fourth is designated by the organization.



Definitions

- A *job* is defined as "a set of tasks and duties performed, or meant to be performed, by one person, including for an employer or in self-employment".
- A *job family* is a grouping of similar jobs at the highest level that usually consists of several professions and occupations.
- Profession is a disciplined group of individuals who adhere to ethical standards and
 who hold themselves out as, and are accepted by the public as possessing special
 knowledge and skills in a widely recognized body of learning derived from research,
 education and training at a high level, and who are prepared to apply this knowledge
 and exercise these skills in the interest of others.
- Occupation refers to the kind of work performed in a job. The concept of occupation is defined as a "set of jobs whose main tasks and duties are characterized by a high degree of similarity". A person may be associated with an occupation through the main job currently held, a second job, a future job or a job previously held.
- Job tasks are duties or responsibilities that is performed on a job.
- Job title is a term or few words that provides a meaningful description of the job tasks.
