

Weekly COVID-19 Spending Report

Week 14

Total Health Spending*

MVR 1,098.8 million
as at 30 July 2020

As at 30 July 2020, total spending towards COVID-19 health efforts stood at MVR 1,098.8 million; a 0.5% increase from the week before. In this review period 53.3% of total health spending was committed-spending.

In terms of week-on-week spending, only the primary front-line agencies such as NDMA, MoH, IGMH and MNDF spent towards the pandemic health efforts. Noteworthy spendings include MVR 2.9 million on the provision of allowances to employees, and MVR 1.2 million on medical consumables by IGMH. Between 26 and 30 July 2020, approximately MVR 1.6 million was spent on medical consumables and food provision to covid-19 patients.

Total Economic Response Spending**

As at 30 July 2020, total disbursements made to ERP schemes stood at MVR 597.1 million; a 1.3% increase from the week before. To date, total disbursements made towards the Income Support scheme, COVID-19 Recovery Loan scheme and Discount on Electricity Bills were MVR 35.1 million, MVR 550.0 million and MVR 12.0 million, respectively.

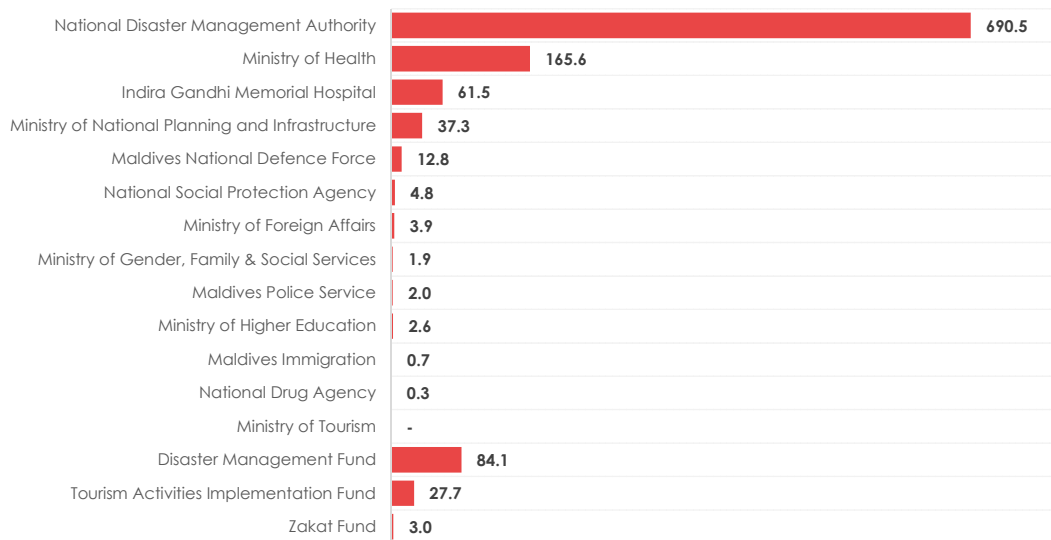
Over the past week, disbursements made towards NSPA increased by 29.2% (MVR 7.9 million) for the implementation of the Income Support scheme. No additional allocations were made to utility companies for the Discount on Electricity Bills, and banks implementing the COVID-19 Recovery Loan scheme this week.

Note that additional allocations may not yet be reflected in the Public Bank Account. Data are likely to vary as reconciliation work is ongoing.

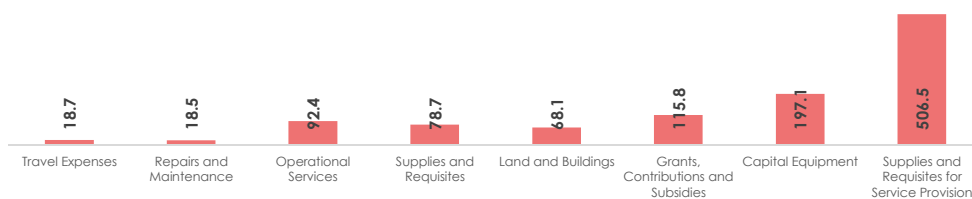
By Business Area & Trust Fund***

DEFINITIONS

Committed Spending	Total value of Purchase Orders and Invoices not paid yet for an account.
Total COVID-19 Spending	Sum of Recurrent and Capital spendings towards COVID-19 activities.
Recurrent Spending	Spendings committed to COVID-19 related operational expenses such as medical consumables (e.g. masks and gloves).
Capital Spending	Spendings committed to COVID-19 related capital such as ventilators, medical facilities and isolation facilities.
Supplies and Requisites for Service Provision	This category primarily includes spendings on medical consumables, test kits and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
Grants, Contributions and Subsidies	This category primarily includes spendings which extend direct assistance to those in need, and spending from the Disaster Management Fund to stock up staple food.
Land and Buildings	This category includes spendings on the construction of structures used to treat and counter COVID-19. It primarily includes medical, isolation and quarantine facilities.
Capital Equipment	This category includes spendings on COVID-19 related diagnostic equipment, medical equipment for medical facilities, and furniture for new medical and isolation facilities.
Purchase Order	Transaction for which purchase orders are raised in the public accounting system.
Invoices Not Paid Yet	Goods and Services are received and Invoices are posted in the public accounting system.
Payments	Funds have been paid and the transaction is closed.
Income Support	This scheme will provide allowances to Maldivian workers who are unemployed or had their salaries (earnings for self-employed/ freelance workers) affected due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
COVID-19 Recovery Loan Scheme	The scheme is designed to provide financing for large businesses, SMEs, self-employed and freelance individuals affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Ministry of Finance has partnered with Bank of Maldives and SME Development Finance Corporation to support the implementation of this scheme.

Note: All references to "good and services" in this report pertain to COVID-19 related efforts, including instances where it is not explicitly stated. Definitions have been revised on 17 May 2020
