As at 16 July 2020, total spending towards COVID-19 health efforts stood at MVR 1,078.3 million; a 3.4 % increase from the week before. In this review period 53.5 % of total health spending was committed-spending.

In terms of week-on-week spending, IGMH has been the key agency spending towards COVID-19 health efforts. Most significant spendings were allocated towards the procurement of medical consumables. Other noteworthy spending was by Ministry of National Planning and Infrastructure on Land and Building related to COVID-19 efforts.

As at 16 July 2020, total disbursements made to ERP schemes stood at MVR 521.0 million; a 24.9% increase from the week before


Over the past week, disbursements made towards NSPA increased by 21.9% (MVR 21.0 million) for the implementation of the Income Support scheme. Another allocation of MVR 100.0 million was made to banks implementing the COVID-19 Recovery Loan scheme this week.

Note that additional allocations may not yet be reflected in the Public Bank Account. Data are likely to vary as reconciliation work is ongoing.

| Committed Spending | Total value of Purchase Orders and Invoices not paid yet for an account. |
| Total COVID-19 Spending | Sum of Recurrent and Capital spendings towards COVID-19 activities. |
| Recurrent Spending | Spendings comitted to COVID-19 related operational expenses such as medical consumables (e.g. masks and gloves). |
| Capital Spending | Spendings committed to COVID-19 related capital such as ventilators, medical facilities and isolation facilities. |
| Supplies and Requisites for Service Provision | This category primarily includes spendings on medical consumables, test kits and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) |
| Grants, Contributions and Subsidies | This category primarily includes spendings which extend direct assistance to those in need, and spending from the Disaster Management Fund to stock up staple food. |
| Land and Buildings | This category includes spendings on the construction of structures used to treat and counter COVID-19. It primarily includes medical, isolation and quarantine facilities. |
| Capital Equipment | This category includes spendings on COVID-19 related diagnostic equipment, medical equipment for medical facilities, and furniture for new medical and isolation facilities. |
| Purchase Order | Transaction for which purchase orders are raised in the public accounting system. |
| Invoices Not Paid Yet | Goods and Services are received and Invoices are posted in the public accounting system. |
| Payments | Funds have been paid and the transaction is closed. |
| Income Support | This scheme will provide allowances to Maldivian workers who are unemployed or had their salaries (earnings for self-employed/ freelance workers) affected due to the COVID-19 pandemic. |
| COVID-19 Recovery Loan Scheme | The scheme is designed to provide financing for large businesses, SMEs, self-employed and freelance individuals affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Ministry of Finance has partnered with Bank of Maldives and SME Development Finance Corporation to support the implementation of this scheme. |
