MONTHLY FISCAL DEVELOPMENTS

March 2022

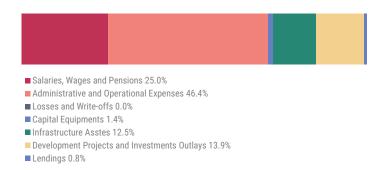
Revenue and Grants for March 2022 stood at MVR 2,708.99 million, which is a 43.4 percent increase compared to March 2021. A significant proportion of this relative increase is due to the marked increment in GST receipts.

Total Expenditure for March 2022 increased by 30.3 percent compared to the same month of 2021. Compared to March 2021, Capital Expenditure increased by 40 percent and Recurrent Expenditure increased by 26.8 percent. The relative hike in Capital Expenditure was due an increase in Land and Buildings and other infrastructure Assets.

Fiscal Balance for the month of March 2022 gives an overall deficit of MVR 1.26 million.

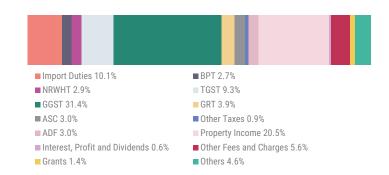


EXPENDITURE COMPOSITION - MARCH
