Total Health & Social Spending*

MVR 2.069.8

As of 19 August 2021, total spending towards COVID-19 health and social efforts stood at MVR 2,069.8 million; a 1.0% increase from the week before. In this review period, 34.2% of total health and social spending was committed-spending.

In terms of week-on-week spending, Ministry of Health registered the highest spending compared to its peers. The spending was mainly on Supplies and Requisites for Service Provision. The next significant spending was by the National Social Protection Agency on Grants, Contributions and Subsidies. Over the review period, other agencies only reported small incremental changes in their spending.

Over the review period, no further disbursements were made towards the ERP schemes.




By Business Area & Trust Fund***
