





Add DNS entry in Hosts File


Modifying your hosts file

To add a DNS entry in hosts file:


1. Press the Windows key.
2. Type Notepad in the search field.
3. Right-click Notepad and select Run as administrator.



4. From Notepad, open the following file: c:\Windows\System32\Drivers\etc\hosts



5. Add the host name and IP address at the bottom of the hosts file. Enter “**10.244.7.17**[press tab]**prbici01.finance.gov.mv**[press Enter]”
